## Book (one author)

Example: Parson, Alexander. *Amazing Spiders*. New York: Scholastic Inc., 2010.

Author's Last Name,	First Name.	<i>Book Title.</i>	Place of Publication:	Publisher(company),	Copyright Date.

## Book (no author)

Example: *Volcanoes*. London: Heinemann, 2009.

<i>Book Title.</i>	Place of Publication:	Publisher (company),	Copyright Date.

## Book (two, three or more authors)

Ex. - Two Authors: McKissack, Patricia, and Fredrick McKissack. *African-American Inventors*. Brookfield: Scholastic Press, 2009.

Ex. - Three Authors: Thompsen, Adam, Mary Jenson, and Dori Graham. *Trains*. Chicago: Capstone Press, 2007.

Ex. - More than Three Authors: Adams, Barry, et al. *Encyclopedia of Great Civilizations*. New York: Capstone Press, 2010.

## Encyclopedia Article

Example: Minch, Edwin W. "Spiders." *World Book Encyclopedia*. Chicago, 2010 ed.

Author's Last Name,(if there is one)	First Name.	"Article Title."	<i>Encyclopedia Title.</i>	Place of Publication,	Copyright Date.

## Magazine Article

Example: Churchman, Deborah. "Be a Nature Detective." *Ranger Rick*. March 2010: 28-31.

Author's Last Name,	First Name.	"Article Title."	<i>Magazine Title.</i>	Issue Date (Day, Month Year):	Page #s.

## Newspaper Article

Example: Stern, Henry. "Texas Animals in Danger." *Houston Chronicle*. 9 Apr. 2010.  
D01.
